Andy McConnell is one of Britain's leading authorities on glassware of all types, and his books have covered the subject from 1650 to the present. He was the first glass specialist recruited to BBC TV's Antiques Roadshow, for which he has now recorded twelve series. He lectures widely on glass and writes for journals as diverse as The Times & Daily Telegraph, Country Life, Homes & Antiques & Glass Circle News. Andy is a witty, spontaneous speaker who is delighted to share his knowledge and enthusiasm for the subject with the audience on the day. He and his wife, Helen, run Glass Etc. in Rye, Sussex.

Stewart and Kathryn Hearn both live and work in Chatteris, near Ely, Cambridgeshire.

For 26 years, until 2016, **Kathryn** had been Course Director for the BA (Hons) Ceramic Design Course and Subject Leader for the MA Design: Ceramics at Central Saint Martins University of the Arts, London. She is now a full-time ceramic artist. Some of her recent projects include *Ebb and Flow*, five pop-up gardens with seven artists at Chiswick Mall, London. One of four contributors to the recent summer exhibition at Groundwork Gallery in King's Lynn with art, ecology and the environment, Regarding Nature, Outfalls and Fenland and also Walking on Ancient Ways at Parndon Mill, Harlow with painter Tessa Pemberton. **Stewart** is originally from South Shields, Tyne and Wear and attended Sunderland Polytechnic where he gained a BA(Hons) in 3D Design in Glass and Ceramics. After working alongside Simon Moore, Catherine Hough and Steven Newell at Glassworks(London) Ltd, he set up 'First Glass Partnership' in 1994 with Bob Crooks in Clapham, and later started 'London Glassworks' with Paul Devlin in 2002-06, continuing alone until 2012. He next moved out of London to build the bespoke studio in Chatteris where he now works with Kathryn. He has participated in various exhibitions, won several awards and received commissions including the 'Children's Prize', sponsored by Mark Holford, 2015 & 2017 British Glass Biennale, Stourbridge.

Katharine Coleman (b. Sutton Coldfield, W Midlands 1949) was taught point, drill and copper wheel engraving on glass by Peter Dreiser at Morley College, Lambeth from 1984-7 and continues to explore these techniques in her new workshop in London. She has received numerous prizes and awards and her work is exhibited worldwide. Awarded an MBE for services to glass engraving in 2009, Katharine was elected an Honorary Liveryman of the Worshipful Company of Glass Sellers of London and a Freeman of the City of London in June 2015. She is also an elected member of Contemporary Applied Arts, a Fellow of the Guild of Glass Engravers (2001 - 2015), a Brother of the Art Workers Guild, and member of The Glass Circle, Contemporary Glass Society and The Glass Association.
