

Sylvie Lhermite-King: The Art of Flame Glass Working Thursday, 28th June 2018



The art of glass flame working may be traced back to antiquity. The technique, consisting of fusing clear and coloured glass canes to fashion beads, jewels, objects and figurines with the aid of pincers and tongs, has essentially remained unchanged over millennia.

From the 16th to the 19th century, the most important centres of production were Venice, Innsbruck, Nevers, Saumur, Paris and Dresden. A catalogue illustrating the talk will be available.

Sylvie Lhermite-King is a specialist in Venetian and Façon de Venise glass and a member of the Syndicat Français des Experts Professionnels en oeuvres d'art et objets de collection (S.F.E.P.), the Syndicat National des Antiquaires (S.N.A.), an expert at The European Fine Art Fair (TEFAF), Maastricht, and at l'Hôtel Drouot Her Paris gallery A La Façon de Venise specialises in Italian, French and Spanish glass and objets d'art of the 16th to 18th centuries. She is the author of exhibition catalogues *Cent* verres français, 1550-1750 (2008), and Verres de la Renaissance, origines & influences (2013).

Queen Square lies between Southampton Row and Gt. Ormond St. It can be reached by Underground using either Russell Sq. (Piccadilly) or Holborn (Piccadilly and Central).
