
Frederick Carder and the secret plan for the immigration of Stourbridge glassworkers

7pm (BST), Tuesday 3rd October 2023

On 3 October 1903, the County Express revealed this local news in a single sentence: 'This week ten "Society" glassmen have left the neighbourhood for America.' Glassworkers from the Stourbridge district attempted to immigrate to America because Frederick Carder promised them jobs in the new Steuben Glass Works at Corning, New York, Details of this venture

remain unreported, including those regarding members of the Stourbridge chapter of the National Flint Glass Makers' Society of Great Britain and Ireland. This presentation provides the full story of a remarkable episode.

James Measell is a frequent contributor to *Glass Matters*, *The Blackcountryman* and other publications. He serves as a trustee of the Stourbridge Glass Museum and is an Honorary Research Fellow at the University of Birmingham.
