Please arrive at Shackerstone Station for 10.45am and park in the car park – Be ready to catch the 11.15am train to Shenton Station (a 20 minute ride away by steam train).

At Shenton Station, Richard has his hot glass studio in the station building itself. So we just step off the train, arriving around 11.35am. A buffet lunch will be provided. (Sandwiches, quiches, pies, fruit etc.). Tea, coffee and soft drinks are available to be purchased from the station buffet just next door. At the end of our visit we return by steam train and there is a choice of two trains at 3.35pm or 4.50pm from Shenton back to Shackerstone Station and our cars.

Station Glass - Richard Golding, founder of Okra Glass in 1979, opened his glass studio in Shenton Station at the end of the Battlefield preserved railway line in 2010. At the station Richard has his state of the art hot glass studio and gallery where you can sit, watch him make glass and buy unique Station Glass Creations. http://www.stationglass.com/ Richard's glass is highly collectible and features in museums, galleries and private collections around the world. Renowned for his glass recipes and designs, use of iridescence, reduction, colour and surface decoration, Richard is seen by many as one of the top studio glassmakers working today*. (*He made the blanks for the recent Portland vase project which were engraved byTerri Colledge).

Especially for the Glass Association's visit, Richard will be making a piece on the day inspired by the GA symbol which will be auctioned at a later event. For this visit the group size maximum is 20-25. It's bound to be a popular event so please book early. (The price is all inclusive for the train and lunch buffet).
